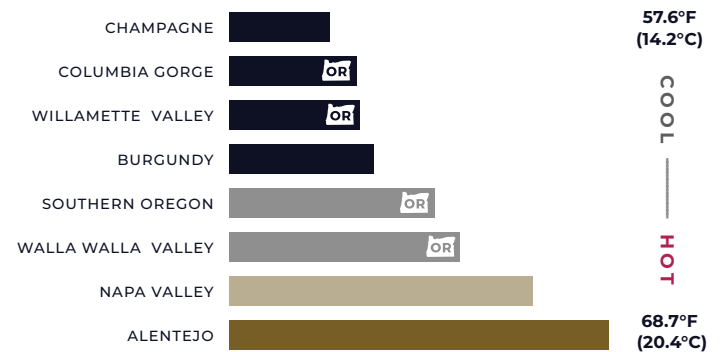
Climate

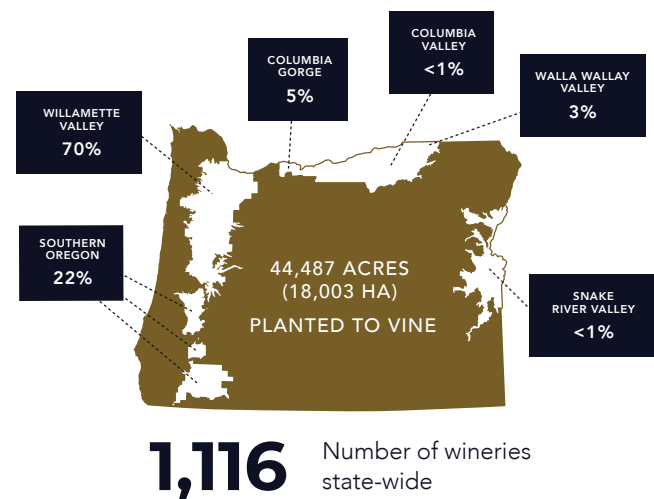
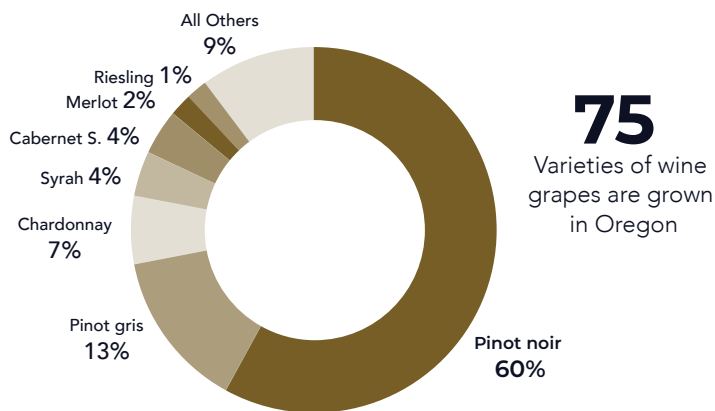


AVERAGE GROWING SEASON TEMPERATURE °F (°C)



Vineyards

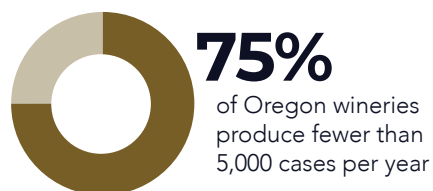
Pinot noir is the predominant variety grown in Oregon; however, the state's diversity of geography and microclimates make it well-suited to many different varieties.
